May Day Together Training Event May 1

We will gather at 9:30 AM at Sandy Point State Park for a COVID-safe training event. This will be the chance to get the scoop on sailing with SOS and follow up with an individual training program in the sailing areas you need to learn or review. We have courses on knots, sailing terminology and nomenclature, emergency equipment, sail trim, and sailing apps. It will be a great chance to get outdoors, meet your fellow SOSers and prepare for a great and safe summer on the water. The cost is \$20 plus a \$5 admission fee to the state park. For safety you will have to bring you own lunch, wear a mask, and practice social distancing.

Sailing Safely many questions

about doing it safely. Results from the recent member survey, plus feedback from skippers and members, indicate that many prefer to sail with those who have been vaccinated. Mask wearing has also been an issue of concern.

As most of you know, Maryland Governor Hogan has relaxed indoor dining restrictions, but still requires social distancing and masks. All of this is a bit more complex when applied to boating!

So, we are adding several vaccine related questions to the cruise registration forms which everyone fills out to enroll for a sail. Hopefully this information will permit the cruise coordinators to have the relevant information right upfront when arranging suggested placements. Here are sample questions:

For Everyone: I have not been vaccinated; I have received 1 of 2 shots; I am fully vaccinated; I choose to not answer.

For Crew: I am comfortable sailing with crew who have not been vaccinated; I will sail if everyone is partially vaccinated; I will only sail if everyone is vaccinated.

For Skippers: I will accept crew regardless of vaccination status; I will only accept fully vaccinated crew: I will accept partially vaccinated crew; I will only accept crew I invite; I am not accepting crew.

Bear in mind that the answers to these questions will no doubt be different for overnight dav sails VS sails. Preferences will also be shifting with the passage of time and decrease in general community infection rates.

Masks are a more complex issue. First, anyone on a boat may choose to wear a mask at any time, and everyone is

advised to bring a mask along. Second. circumstances and ability to keep social distance vary greatly, as for example, being on deck in a good breeze vs being below. A large boat vs a small boat, etc. Therefore, there will only be one mask related question. For skippers: I prefer crew wear masks most of the time. When skippers contact their crew, there will be opportunity to discuss what their preferences are regarding mask wearing. Everyone should have a mask along!

Our sailing season will be off to a great start on May 1, with the "May Day Together" training event at Sandy Point State Park. The ever-popular Dockside Training follows on May 2 at the boats of a variety of SOS skippers. The traditional Cruising Kick off is planned May 8 at Port Annapolis for Marina. May will also bring a host of day sails plus the DNR event on May 22 -23.

Vice Commodore: Nothing to add.

Treasurers Report:

Highlights

- 1. Net income for the month is virtually the same as February 2020.
- 2. The only expenses incurred have been for club overhead.
- 3. 1.2% increase in PO Box rental.
- 4. 2021 renewals are behind 2020 by \$1,574.
- 5. FM request for \$100 added to their budget was approved.

Secretaries Report: Nothing to add.

Committee Reports:

Bareboat - Applications are being accepted for September Canal trip Sept 3 - 10 and Sept 10 - 17. There are five mostly full boats for week One and one boat for week Two with space. There are four more boats on hold. Need both skippers and crew. A Zoom presentation on geography, history, and culture of the Alsace Region. Date March 26. We have prepared a survey to the general membership on future destinations. A Bareboat Zoom presentation has been scheduled for Friday, March 12th, for new members.

Brunch – There will be a spring Brunch on April 25. The presentation by our speaker Dr. Colin Rees on climate change impacts in and around the Bay should be fascinating and timely in the Doubletree large ballroom. Seating will be four to each 10person round table. There will be an open bar and we'll be served a plated breakfast or lunch. Brunch selections are omelet with pancakes, or grilled chicken with BBQ sauce and pineapple salsa; selections will be required at registration.

<u>**Cruising**</u> – Details of the season Kickoff are being planned. Bookings for events have been attended to. Individual event coordinators are being selected.

The Board approved the Cruising Calendar. Action was requested to define the "Rules of Engagement" for our sails. Particularly, do we gather data on who is vaccinated and share it with coordinators and skippers for decision making.

The 2021 Cruising schedule has been uploaded to the SOS Long Range Planning Calendar. Which has been approved by the Board, The calendar will be uploaded to the Events calendar.

Education – On Friday Feb 26th we tried out the Zoom **breakout** room feature. By using three breakout rooms. Feedback indicated the majority of the people liked the new feature. Planning for our **May Day Together Training Event** on May 1, 2021 at Sandy Point State Park continues. The pavilion has been rented for the full day – 11 hours, we will be done around 4 pm. At this point, Frist Mates have scheduled their event to follow ours.

<u>First Mates</u> – The FM meeting and picnic has been scheduled for Sat May 1 at Sandy Point Park.

Membership – A Call Committee was formed to reach out to members who had not renewed their 2021 Membership as of 2/1/2021. There were 115 non-renewal Lifetime/Regular Members and 21 non-renewal Skipper Members. Responses were compiled and summarized. Seven New Member Packets were mailed to new Members as of 3/1.

Public Relations – The general public/non-members are **not** invited to participate in the April 25 brunch or the May 1 outdoor Spring Training. PR has continued to reach out to members to proactively create a resource of regional locations to encourage outdoor social gatherings. PR feels our focus really needs to be toward Skipper membership recruitment.

Skippers Advisory ZOOM Skippers' Happy Hours have continued biweekly on Wednesdays between 7 and 8 PM. On March 24, 2021 Chuck Fort will do a Rafting Presentation via ZOOM in place of the regular HH. Skipper Flare Exchange May 8th

Most of you are aware that the club has historically had a Flare and Safety Day in April every



year. Regrettably we won't be having it this year, but we have decided to still have a Flare Exchange for skippers who are interested and who qualify. The old flares we collect this year will be used at the Flare and Safety Day next year.

For skippers who have sailed at least once with the club in 2018, 2019, or 2020, the Safety Committee will exchange a maximum of two packets total for either 12-gauge aerial Alert flares or hand-held Locator flares with new packets. Flares should be no more than four years out of date.

You may request an exchange of one SOLAS flare or one packet of Smoke flares at a cost of \$30.00 each. Flares more than four years out of date can be donated (no exchange) and will be used in the demonstration or turned into the Annapolis Fire Department for disposal.

The exchange will take place at the Cruising Kick-off on **Saturday**, **May 8th.**

Please let me know by **April 24th** whether you would like to participate in the exchange, as well as what flares you are turning in and what flares you are requesting.

Louise Burke Nomination to National Sailing Hall of Fame



SOS Member Louise Kevin Burke was a

nationally known sailor, well-regarded and respected by the U.S. sailing community and beyond. She was a pioneer in the acceptance of women into the professional sailing ranks, just as she was instrumental in promoting safety issues and storm survival at sea. In her over 35 years of professional sailing experience, Louise exemplified the highest ideals of responsibility, safety and preparation in all the crews and sailors whose lives she touched. She passed away in June of this year.

To recognize and honor her lifetime achievements, Louise has been nominated for induction into the prestigious National Sailing Hall of Fame. The NSHF promotes sailing by recognizing its heroes; highlighting sailing's contribution to the American culture and experience; and demonstrating its value as a hands-on tool for scholastic and life skills learning.



Every spring the Selection Committee, comprised of individuals from across the sailing industry, convenes to determine which sailing heroes will be the next Inductees to the National Sailing Hall of Fame. While they select the inductees, nominations are made through an open and inclusive process by the sailing community, the marine industry, members of the press and the general public.
