## **Cruising Corner**

Now that the cruising season is off to a great start, it is time to think about the marina/land-based events this season. Some are coordinated, some are not. Some the club makes the reservation, some the skipper does. Some the club pays for the slip (with skippers taking at least one crew from coordination), some are paid by skippers. For all coordinated events, signing up early will help the coordinators plan.

For the Anniversary Party June 25-26 at Lankford Bay Marina, the club will reserve the slips and pay for those slips where the skippers take at least one crew from the coordination. For the skippers paying for their own slips, the price is \$2.25 per foot, and electric is \$8.00 per 30-amp connection,

Since it is early to know where all the fireworks will be on which nights, one option is to go to St. Michaels for July 2, and Rock Hall for July 3, and sail home on July 4. Skippers can anchor out, rafting in pods or linear rafts near St. Michaels and Rock Hall. If the skippers and crew want to pay to be ashore in St. Michaels, two options are Higgins Boat Yard and the Chesapeake Bay Maritime Museum (CBMM). Higgins will take reservations for a minimum of three nights. The cost would be \$2.75 per foot per night. CBMM members at the Mariner level and higher can make a reservation on their website one month ahead (June 2 for July 2-4) for a two-night minimum stay. The cost would be \$2.75 per foot per night. There are many marinas in Rock Hall to choose from with assorted prices and requirements.

The Town Hall Meeting will be held this year at the Chesapeake Yacht Club in Shadyside on the West River. This is not a coordinated sail in event. If skippers

Thanks to Committee Chairs and Board Members for their future help in this transition.




## **Directions**

## When and How Did SOS Get a Burgee?



The first SOS burgee was unveiled on the auspicious occasion of the 1982 Anniversary Party on June 19<sup>th</sup>, four years after the Club's founding. It was formally raised at the July 4 cruise on the flagship "Sol de Mar", owned and skippered by Duane Hull, a retired professional artist and Navy man.

The Burgee and the Whisker Pole masthead were designed by Duane, and he contributed his artwork to several newsletter issues and directory covers. His humorous artwork frequently graced the pages of the newsletter back in the day when the Whisker Pole was created on a typewriter and mailed (gasp!).

## **Volunteer Recognition Program**

Singles On Sailboats has been governed for the last 40 plus years by members who have volunteered their time, efforts, and energy to the club.   - · Standard ongoing roles that provide critical infrastructure for club activities; acknowledgement will be specific to person
- "Above and Beyond" ~An SOS member who contributes significant time, effort and skills to ensure SOS events are successfully conducted.
  - Willing to step in when a need arises; sees situation and creates solution; worker bee
- 4. "Extraordinaire" ~An SOS member who contributes an extraordinary amount of time, effort and skills to ensure SOS functions meet the goals and needs of the club and its members
  - Took on many hours and much work to develop, create, implement items and opportunities we would not have managed COVID
    as a healing club without their contributions

Consequently, these new members immediately felt welcomed, understand (as much as any member) the ways of SOS and participated in activities right from the start. At an SOS event, one of Julia's mentees was overhead to say, "I'll ask Julia, she knows what to do". - that signifies the importance of Julia's time and energy and Membership's Mentor/Navigator Program. New members are immediately participating in events, getting to know SOS's culture, and wanting to get involved.





## Anne Bastian – "Keep SOS Floating"

Anne stepped up to the plate and agreed this year to be a Cruising Coordinator Leader for the Annapolis Area. When Anne accepted the position, she wasn't totally sure what the responsibilities were; even so, she gladly fulfilled the tasks. Additionally, Anne has taken the time to mentor a few new members making them feel welcomed while sharing how to become involved in SOS. She made a point of selecting and/or encouraging relatively new members in the Annapolis area to coordinate weekend sails or participate in a coordination. Under Anne's guidance these members have become a major asset to the club.

## Cruising Courtesy by Janet Stone

Several years ago, I was given a list by one of our skippers of his "pet peeve" issues concerning crew. I polled some other skippers, and the result was an article on cruising courtesy. I have recently been asked to update this information and pass it on to the Whisker Pole. It contains items that generally go without speaking, however, new members may find it helpful. And, as always, it never hurts any of us to be reminded of "cruising courtesy" now and then. Originally written as several columns, it may appear as a lengthy discourse on rather rigid rules. To the contrary, all suggestions were made by skippers in an attempt to keep our sailing safe, fun and free of conflict. If you haven't sailed with us yet, you will find we are a diverse, multi-faceted and funloving group.

#### Preparing to Sail:

- Do not expect the boat to meet your personal schedule of when to depart and arrive; sailing involves too many variables.
- Remember that a weekend on a boat is not a weekend at the Marriott; you should not expect all the comforts of home.
- Leave the red Samsonite at home with the red wine (although, I am personally delighted to say that some skippers allow careful imbibing of red wine on their boats!); soft luggage, duffel bags, etc. are preferred.
- Pack as lightly as possible; excessive baggage poses a problem in the limited space on a boat. AND contrary to popular belief, it is possible to sail for two days <u>without</u> three changes of clothing per day!
- Do not expect the boat to have foul weather gear, etc. for you.
- Bring all personal toiletries; i.e., shampoo, soap, towels, sleeping bags, etc. Do not expect to find these on board.
- Only boat or white-soled shoes (sneakers) should be worn on board.
- Lotion or gel sun blocks should be used; oils or greasy tanning products should not be brought on the boat.
- Keep meals simple; save the large, difficult creations for a dinner party at home and invite us all to a "nonsanctioned" SOS event!
- Pre-chill food and drinks brought on board.
- Tell the skipper/crew if you have a medical problem and how to handle it; several members fall into this category and it does not hamper anyone's good time when everyone is aware of any problem and thus prepared.
- If you are experiencing serious medical problems that can be expected to "flare up," cancel your cruise.
- If you must cancel the week of the cruise, it is your responsibility to find someone to replace your meal(s) or see that it gets to the boat.

- There's no such thing as a free ride; you'll be expected to participate in boat handling.
- Do not be afraid to say "I don't understand" if the skipper gives a command that is not clear to you.
- Remember, your skipper is not a charter boat skipper; you are his/her guest.
- Crew should not expect to pick their own berths; the skipper will make assignments
- Make sure you are checked out by the skipper or first mate on operation of stove/oven and head; report problems immediately.
- Do not strike a light, if you smell "gas" fumes.

#### **Under Sail:**

- Be certain ice chest/refrigeration door is closed tightly.
- Be considerate in your use of water; tankage is limited.
- Turn out lights after each use.
- Do not "loan" your boat's equipment or galley utensils to others without the skipper's permission.
- Be on time for meals to cook or eat at the agreed upon time.
- Do not expect others to clean up after you; if you prepare a meal, plan on cleaning up, as well, unless other crew offer to take care of this detail.
- Accidents happen. If you should lose or break anything, report it to the skipper.
- Do not jump overboard without the skipper's permission...REALLY..this does happen!
- In raft ups, cross over the bow of boats only, unless invited to pass through the stern by the skipper.
- Enter the cabins of other boats only upon invitation.
- Do not embarrass your boat or yourself by your behavior.
- Enjoy yourself without drinking to excess and becoming a problem for your skipper and crew.
- Do not sail off on someone else's boat without the skipper's permission. Cupid may strike, but your crew may depend upon you for the return sail!
- Respect other people's privacy.
- Respect other people's property.
- Do not use up your boat's supplies and take yours home because you didn't need to use them.
- Do not leave the boat at the raft or at the dock until the skipper releases you.
- And a few last DON'Ts:
  - DON'T hesitate to ask "nautical" questions
  - DON'T hesitate to report boat problems to the skipper
  - DON'T fail to offer help when it might be needed
- Most importantly, leave your problems and worries at home and have a GOOD TIME!

The Triple Crown of Charity Sailing was created in 2018 to recognize the top sailor and fundraiser for The Leukemia Cup, The CRAB Cup, and The Hospice Cup races.

Cruising Class in the new Maryland Leukemia Cup race on June 4.

On his sweet boat *Ingenuity* and with his crew of two -- which included his friend who enjoys the event so much he's made it an annual trip from Chicago to participate – they were part of a small fleet of 5 in that class. Joe said there is a new class PHRF Cruising which may have more competition and he is considering that fleet for his next race. Although the day started with light winds, it built to make for a very enjoyable event.






