First Mate Cruise & General Cruise, June 14-15 (Reg deadline June 4. Skippers, help support the First Mate Cruise! Please register for this cruise where First Mates will practice their skills on your boat, followed by a joint raft up with the General Cruise in Round Bay. (Crew is invitation only for the First Mate Cruise). The General Cruise follows the standard process for Skipper and crew registrations.

47th Anniversary Party Cruise, June 21-22 (Reg deadline, June 11). Help us celebrate 47 years of SOS at Port Annapolis with a sail & shore party! Skippers need to book their slips with Dockwa directly - our goal is to have at least 15 slips booked to get the discount on the marina pavilion.

Independence Day Cruise, July 4-6 Reg deadline, June 24). We will welcome July with a cruise to St. Michaels for their Chesapeake Bay Maritime Museum Big Band night and fireworks on Saturday July 5, as well as experience what the wonderful town has to offer!

Skippers: Take Note!

Slips for 4th July Cruise

You need to book a slip early or choose to anchor and dinghy in. The club will reimburse you for 1 night of slip rental/electricity if you accept at least one crew from coordination. The second night cost can be shared between Skipper and crew.

St. Michael's Marinas: The two best options are the Chesapeake Bay Maritime Museum (CBMM) and Higgins Yacht Yard.

• CBMM: You must be a mariner or higher-level member to book a slip. It is a great organization to support through membership. For this holiday weekend, there is a 2nightminimum requirement.

You MUST make a reservation EXACTLY one month in advance at midnight (June 4 midnight for July 4) using Dockwa and noting that you are with Singles on Sailboats.

VIEW FROM THE BRIDGE

Ahoy, Mates.

Thinking about our upcoming Anniversary in June, I wondered: How did we arrive at this remarkable place in time—Singles on

Sailboats, a 47-year-old, 400-person community of single sailors who share a passion for the Chesapeake Bay, the joys of sailing, and lifelong friendships? The answer, like the Bay itself, winds through centuries of exploration, culture, and human connection.

Our journey began across the Atlantic, in the Age of Discovery, when European mariners pushed past the edges of the known world. In the late 1300's, experts from the Majorcan School of navigation assisted Portuguese explorers like Henry the Navigator to sail the coastlines of Africa and the East Indies, and to map the world as they knew it. A century later Columbus sailed across the Atlantic into the Caribbean, thinking it was the Pacific, without understanding the size of the globe, though Ptolemy had defined it previously in the 2nd century AD.

Within a few generations, Captain John Smith was exploring the Chesapeake in the early 1600s, describing its beauty and abundance in vivid detail. He published the first chart in 1608, the map used to steer the ships Ark and the Dove to St. Mary's in 1633-1634. After John Harrison invented the chronometer in the mid-late 1700s, the oceans were opened for further discovery, especially by the British. Annapolis, a colonial outpost, grew into a vibrant port of trade and sailing.

Of course, for thousands of years before European contact, the indigenous people, the Piscataways, Choptanks, and other Algonquian peoples lived along these shores, fishing, trading, and navigating the same rivers and inlets we sail today.

Their presence and legacy are woven into the discoveries, and the land and water around us.

Now, our home waters are filled with everything from tall ships to high-tech racing yachts, following centuries of technological advancement and changing tastes. Yet some things remain constant: the wind, the waves, and the yearning to be on the water.

Out of this rich maritime tradition, Singles on Sailboats was born in 1978. What began as a small gathering of kindred spirits has evolved into a welcoming community, connected not by background or birthplace, but by a shared love of sailing and the Chesapeake. Our members come from all walks of life each with their own story of how they found this Bay and SOS.

We have grown with the times, embracing new technologies, and new ways to connect. We sail with GPS now, but we mostly sail with heart, laughter, friendship, and a deep respect for the waters that hold the history of generations past.

So how did we "get" here? By wind and courage, by chance and by chart. And we continue forward – buoyed by tradition, steered by community, and always guided by the timeless call of the Chesapeake Bay.

Week of September 7, 2025 – September 13, 2025, Canadian Yacht Charter. There are no more boats available to lease for the period we desire. Lake Huron informational briefing to be held May 10th from 3 – 6pm at the Hollendurskys'.

The 2025 "Dinghy Dance!"

Sunday June 29, 1:00-3:30

Are you wondering what a Dinghy Dance is? We use that term to refer to the art of getting in and out of a dinghy on the water! That's one of the things we work on at the Dinghy Dance.

This fun training session begins with a brief presentation on various PFDs and a presentation on the safe and effective use of a dinghy. We show a video on techniques some members use to get in and out of a dinghy from a shore or a swim platform.

Then, since the training is held at a member's private pool with a real dinghy, we are able to jump into the water and practice getting in and out of a dinghy in deep water and on land. We test some of the techniques that experienced dinghy users rely on, like a stepping strap or a line with knots in

it, tied across the dinghy. Last year almost every participant who tried to get into the dinghy in deep water was able to use our tried-and-true techniques!

In addition, we bring various types of PFDs. Participants are able to try them on and practice putting them on in deep water. They quickly see how difficult that is and why it makes so much sense to already have a PFD on in the boat.

We will bring two inflatable PFDs and allow two people to jump into the pool with them on. It's interesting to experience and observe how the inflatable reacts. Afterwards we open

up the inflated PFDs so people can see what's involved in re-arming them.

Selecting & Maintaining Inflatable PFDs

PFDs (personal flotation devices, i.e., life jackets) save lives...but they need to be worn...and they need to be maintained!

Many people wear inflatable life jackets as a great option for protection on the water. They can be more comfortable than other life jackets. There are many options and it's important to know how they work and how to maintain them.

West Marine has a great video on how to select an inflatable PFD based on what water activity you will be engaging in and what your requirements are. You can access that video here:

Buyer's Guide to Inflatable Life Vests

I personally like a model with a harness so it would be easier for people to haul me back in the boat if I go overboard. I also hear a lot of recommendations to have leg straps (crotch straps), so your PFD doesn't ride up when you hit the water especially if you're wearing a lot of clothing...like jackets, foulies, fleece, etc.

Next, it's important to know how to maintain your inflatable PFD. A great video on that can be accessed here: How to self-service an inflatable life jacket | boatsales

At the SOS Annual Dinghy Dance, which will be held on Sunday June 29 this year, we allow two attendees to jump in the pool wearing inflatables. It's interesting to watch and to experience. Everyone seems to think the inflatable takes a little longer to inflate than they anticipate. Afterwards we open up the inflatables and let people look at the inner workings and what would be involved in rearming them.

Bottom line, SOS encourages the use of PFDs. But just like seatbelts you have to get into the habit of using them.

If you are more likely to wear an inflatable than another type of PFD, select one that is compatible with your needs and learn how to safely maintain it! We want all our members to be safe!




