Cruising Corner

We are in the doldrums of summer. In a weather context, the doldrums are a region near the equator where the trade winds converge, resulting in light or variable winds and often calm conditions. More broadly, the term "doldrums" is used to describe a state of inactivity, stagnation, or low spirits, often experienced during the summer months. This can manifest as a feeling of boredom, listlessness, or a lack of motivation.

How to overcome the doldrums – changing your mindset and find opportunities for engagement and activity. Go sailing with SOS – even though it has been hot, we have found wind and fun. We don't think anyone has ever regretted being out on the water!

Time is running out! We only have 2.5 months left on the 2025 cruising calendar, so take advantage of the upcoming cruises. A few highlights:

- Aug 16 17: Seafood Feast: Lankford Bay Marina, pool, food, dancing fun! Skippers, book your slip directly with the marina and mention SOS. If you take crew from coordination, the club will reimburse your slip and electric fees.
- Aug 27 Sept 1: Labor Day 6-Day Extended Cruise: After rafting up in Langford Creek, spend two nights in Chestertown (marina or anchor) and then meet up with the Labor Day 3-Day Cruise in a raft-up in Swan Creek. Then follow the rest of the 3-day schedule. This is a coordinated extended cruise, so Skippers and crew sign up separately.

Skippers, if you want to stay in the marina, please book your slip for Aug. 28 & 29 at the Chestertown Marina.

- Aug 30 Sept 1: Labor Day 3day Cruise: After rafting up in Swan Creek, sail to a raft-up at the Magothy River's Pea Patch Point.
- Sept 13 14: Return to the Scene of the Monster Raft at Drum Point, Wye River. Let's get enough SOS boats for a circle raft!! If your boat is seaworthy, please sign up.

Let's do it! Hope to see you on the water!

Basic Skills Reminder...

The SOS Basic Skills are for sailing enjoyment and safety with other SOS members. The Basic Skills Program is not intended to teach sailing or piloting, but rather to give information needed to be safe and helpful crew.

All current members – whether you are new or not – need to complete at least Level 1 to sail on a weekend cruise. And each member should complete all three levels as soon as possible.

Level I is a minimum skill requirement for all members who sail with SOS.

Level II advances crew to be more knowledgeable with sailing in general and more active crew around the boat.

Level III advances crew sailing knowledge about how a boat moves through water and general navigation.

Important Reminder: Have you completed a Basic Skills level at Dockside Training, during the Flare & Safety Demo, or on a SOS Day Sail? If so, please make sure you've submitted your completed form for it to be recorded in your profile.

VIEW FROM THE BRIDGE

Ahoy, Mates!

The world is too much with us; late and soon,

Getting and spending, we lay waste our powers;

Little we see in Nature that is ours;

We have given our hearts away, a sordid boon!

This Sea that bares her bosom to the moon:

The winds that will be howling at all hours,

And are up-gathered now like sleeping flowers;

For this, for everything, we are out of tune;

It moves us not.—Great God! I'd rather be

A Pagan suckled in a creed outworn;

So might I, standing on this pleasant lea,

Have glimpses that would make me less forlorn;

Have sight of Proteus rising from the sea:

Or hear old Triton blow his wreathèd horn.

- William Wordsworth (Circa 1802, published 1807).

This sonnet came to mind as I followed reports of the catastrophic floods in Texas. It is a reminder of how vulnerable we all are when nature reclaims center stage. What meaning might we relate to these recent terrible floods, or for that matter, our relationship with severe weather at all? Do we take for granted that we might control our lives without considering that there are forces much greater than we that control our destinies? Or can

we establish some equilibrium between those forces we cannot control and our endeavors to understand, prepare for, and cope with these forces?

We live in a world where we like to think we're in control. We chart our courses, check the weather apps, make our float plans, and expect the tides to behave. All while reading our email and sending text messages. But nature does not always play by our rules — and it never has. Wordsworth's lament was about the growing disconnect between people and the natural world during the Industrial Revolution. Today, that disconnection often shows up in our surprise — or disbelief — when the forces of wind and water assert themselves with power beyond prediction.

The National Weather Service was established in 1870 in the Army Signal Corps, largely to provide marine forecasts — to help those at sea understand what they were sailing into. That mission continues, even as weather information needs have evolved and our tools have changed. What has not changed is the need for respect. The sea still teaches us humility, and weather remains a force we live with, not master.

As sailors, we have a front-row seat to nature's moods — and a special relationship with its rhythms. We read the sky, we feel the shifts in the wind, and we know that sometimes the safest thing to do is to reef early or stay ashore.

So how do we live with these forces we can't control? Maybe the answer is not to fight them, but to partner with them. To prepare wisely, act cautiously, and never take the forecast — or the calm — for granted; the parameters are ever changing. The goal is not dominance, but equilibrium. That's the seamanship we practice every time we hoist a sail.

Wishing all of us that the storms pass us by — but not catch us unaware.

Understanding NWS Severe Weather Nomenclature

Here's some information about National Weather Service Watches, Warnings and Advisories. Definitions are easily found on <u>weather.gov</u>

Severe weather <u>Warning</u> means that the event is imminent or already occurring.

Severe weather <u>Watch</u> means that conditions are favorable for occurrence; exact timing or location are unknown.

Small Craft Advisory (SCA) is issued for the Tidal Potomac River and the Chesapeake Bay when one or both of the following conditions are expected to begin within 36 hours:

- 1) Sustained winds of 18 knots to 33 knots; or
- 2) Frequent gusts (duration of two or more hours) between 18 knots and 33 knots; or
- 3) Waves of 4 feet or higher

To find out more, navigate to weather.gov; enter a location, e.g., Thomas Point Light, then hit return. When the forecast appears, scroll down the page to find several hot links associated with the forecast.

Choose the hot link <u>Forecast</u> <u>Discussion</u>. (The forecast discussion is a pretty technical description of the meteorological conditions which led the forecaster to issue that particular forecast.)

Scrolling further down the forecast discussion there is a special section for Aviation weather, and below that a special section for Marine weather. In that section, the forecaster will comment on whether a Small Craft Advisory (SCA) is in effect or might be needed for the forecast location you chose.

Loaner Life Jackets for Kids

This can be a challenge since kids keep growing!

The BoatUS Foundation has a Life Jacket Loaner Program for Kids. This nationwide program allows you to borrow an appropriately sized life jacket for a day or weekend from a loaner site for free. There are many loaner sites in Annapolis and beyond that participate. Life jackets are loaned in this program over 140,000 times every year. Let's make sure those kids wear appropriately sized life jackets!

2025 Photo Contest

Have you taken **great shots** of this year's SOS activities? If so, keep on shooting! If not, start taking photos to be submitted to the 2025 Photo Contest.

Contest Rules:

- 1. Entries must be taken at events in 2025 by the member of SOS submitting the photo. Note: If you are in the photo, you could not be the photographer and your submission will not be accepted (unless on a tripod with a timer, or selfie, which are acceptable). A photo does not necessarily have that event as a theme (a picture of the sunset seen from a raft-up is acceptable, even though there is nothing in the picture to prove that it was taken at a raft-up or cruise.) We are on the "Honor System." An SOS event can be cruising, day sail, a brunch, seminar, destination cruise, shore party, etc.
- 2. This is an amateur photographer contest. Professional photographers, i.e., anyone who earns more than 50 percent of his/her annual income from photography are excluded from the contest.
- 3. Each submission must identify:
 - a. Which SOS event
 - b. Category (see below) the photo is to be submitted
 - c. Name of the photographer
- 4. Cropping and/or image manipulation or enhancement are allowed.
- 5. Each member may submit up to a **total of eight (8) photos**. All images must be cropped to 5:7 ratio with 1024 pixels at the long edge.
- 6. No using AI to add anything to your images except for sky enhancement or replacement.

- 7. No names, watermarks, or borders allowed.
- 8. Images should be submitted in jpg or png format (jpg is preferred).
- 9. **NEW RULE:** The photographer is responsible for securing permission from all SOS members in the photos prior to submitting the photo for consideration. Failure to secure permission will result in photographs being rejected.

Categories: People, Bay Scenes (including sunsets), Sailboats (sailboats under sail, raft-ups), and Destination Cruises — this category includes photos taken during the actual SOS Bareboat destination cruises and photos taken on days when traveling prior to or after a destination cruise, provided the photos are from the same area. (Example; a destination cruise of the Mediterranean may not include photos from a layover in Amsterdam.)

Other Useful Information: Submit your photos in digital format. Send photos by emails as an attachment, or by DropBox, or contact Bob Wright for instructions to upload the Photo Editor's Google drive. Smart phone photos may be submitted. Please select high resolution for photos in your smart phone setup.

Judging: There will be First, Second and Third Place Awards for each of the four categories and a Grand Prize Award. The photos will be judged by a greater Annapolis area professional photographer from outside the club. The judging will be blind, so the Judge will not know which photographer took which photograph. The Judge may add a fourth-place award in any category, if deemed necessary due to the quantity and quality of entries in a category (not to exceed a total of 13 awards including the Grand Prize Photograph).


