Unofficial notes from June16, 2013 Board Meeting

Official June minutes will be posted on the SOS web site when approved in July by the Board of Directors.

Treasurer Report: Finances are pretty much status quo for 2012 vs. 2013. Have received five phone calls on the SOS phone since the phone number was re-published on the website about a month ago.

Bareboat Committee: Italy trip is full with a wait list. Final payments due July 1. After cruise party was held for Antigua trip and refunds have been issued. French Barge trip has 118 people signed up with wait list. Signup is underway for BVI cruise with 30 already signed up.

Brunches: No report

Communications: No report.

Cruising: No report

Database: Registration forms continue to have formatting problems despite numerous attempts to correct. Extremely difficult to make corrections when registration is underway. Membership lists are being made available to Education for New Member BBQ Chats and Dockside Training. Twelve new members have joined since May, all non-skippers.

Education: Have made request to Anne Arundel Community College to hold Spring Training next year on March 15; will find out in November if approved. July 14 is the first meeting of committee to revise Basic Skills. August 10 will be second Dockside Training day. Meeting soon with Chesapeake Sailing School to reinstate the "Just in Time" sailing program. Four New Member BBQ Chats have been scheduled.

First Mates: Fourteen First Mates and six skippers participated in the First Mates Sail with drills being developed by Louie Burke.

Newsletter: Scanning has been completed of 63 past issues of the *Whisker Pole* and they are now on the SOS website. The June newsletter was posted on public side of SOS website. Recommend we select High Star Copy Services as our new printer as a cost saving measure.

Working on policy concerning party refunds when skipper cancels. Discussion about allowing married people to join club in effort to recruit more skippers.

AHOY – DOCKSIDE TRAINING IN AUGUST

SAILBOATS FULL OF FIRST MATES, OH MY!

CHERIE COMLY, FIRST MATE'S ADVISORY CHAIR

On most SOS sails, you'll see just one First Mate (FM) assigned per boat to assist the Skipper, perform Basic Skills checkouts, and help develop the skills of the crew. But once a year, on the First Mates' Cruise, First Mates and First Mate Candidates make up the entire crew on every boat. The First Mates' Cruise provides FMs with the opportunity to sail together, hone their skills, and develop new ones.

This year, we had 6 Skippers and 14 FMs sailing. Navigator (Cliff Baker), Avalon (Marty Halvorsen), and Celebration (Hope Andruss) planned to sail for 3 days. Parfait (Howard Newman), Pacem (Robin Meigel), and Ariosa (Mike Pittinger) sailed for 2 days. Unfortunately, Friday's windy rainy weather postponed sailing for all except Navigator. With its all-weather, fully enclosed cockpit, the crew sailed sans foul weather gear from the Corsica River to the Magothy River. Along the way, the crew verified that the VHF radio was working by calling the automated response system on channel 27, navigated their way down the Chester River in 1 mile visibility, checked the Automatic Identification System (AIS) to determine if any large ships would be in the channel as they crossed the Bay, and learned yet another way to coil lines and tie a bowline.

On Saturday, the full fleet set sail and rendezvoused in Round Bay on the Severn River. We practiced rafting in "Touch, Stop, and Go" passes alongside *Parfait* which looked like a bumper boat, as it was adorned with fenders and floating cushions. In addition, the FMs practiced boat handling under motor power by backing up to a mooring ball or doing figure eights across and through the wind. Maneuverability, especially in reverse, varies tremendously from one boat to another. So, this was an excellent learning experience. At the end of the drills, Howard directed the building of a nose to toes linear raft. The evening included lots of socializing and sharing of appetizers and desserts.

Come Sunday morning, it was time to do some Man Overboard (MOB) recovery. *Avalon* used our "Manny O'Board" dummy to test hoisting a MOB with a halyard and block and tackle. Then, *Pacem* successfully brought a live MOB, Mike, aboard. *Navigator, Parfait*, and *Avalon* shared their Maritime Mobile Service Identity (MMSI) numbers and programmed their VHF radios to try out the Digital Selective Calling (DSC) capabilities. They successfully used individual and group calling, as well as, the position send and request features...very cool.

The weekend was a wonderful chance for First Mates to practice and develop their skills. Thanks go to Louise Burke for developing procedures for us to practice, to all the First Mates that sailed, and especially to all the Skippers that offered their support by participating in the sail!
